At the opening of his most recent remarkable location, in Blue Diamond Road, the Nevada State Democratic governorship candidate Mr. Steve Sisolak, who is also the current Chairman of the Board of Clark County Commissioners, referred to Dr. Maduka as one of the best employer of labor, with the most diversified staff,

considering the strict diversity adherence policy of his Las Vegas Pain Institutes & Medical Centers, which has in its employ, Caucasians, Latinos, Africa Americans, Asians, Pacific-Oceanians and others. He also roundly praised Dr. Maduka for his huge contributions to the economy of his adopted home. A triple professor of Medical Sciences, the multiple award winner was again recognized for his immense contributions to the growth of medicine in Southern Nevada and the US, as well as his amazing philanthropy. It was a congregation of Alist guests from across the US and Africa. Guests of note were Mr. Steve Sisolak, Chairman Clark County Board of Commissioners and Democratic Party governorship candidate for the State of Nevada; Mr.

Ben Chavis, president of the US national association of publishers; Dr. Godwin Maduka, founder of the Las Vegas Pain Institute and Medical Centers, which is the largest pain management franchise in Nevada; Mr. Kingsley Emu, economic planning commissioner for Delta State in Nigeria and his culture & tourism counterpart, Mr. Emmanuel Chinye; both representing Delta state governor, Dr. Ifeanyi Okowa; Lawrence Weekly, Chairman Las Vegas Convention & Visitors Authority (LVCVA); members of the US senate and house of representatives as well as top professionals and business owners.

COMMISSIONER LAWRENCE WEEKLY, was honored at Afrikfest for his remarkable work in the promotion of Las Vegas as a premier destination globally. He is the first African-America to chair the Las Vegas Convention & Visitors Authority (LVCVA). He also sits as chairman of the Board of Trustees for Universal Medical Center Southern Nevada, the Clark

County Liquor & Gaming Licensing Board that awards nearly \$1 million to valley wide programs dedicated to improving the quality of life for families in Clark County. He is also on numerous other boards. A man of many parts, he also hosts a very popular program on Power 88.1 FM, Las Vegas. His remarkable work in the promotion and unification of the black community is awesome.

Nigeria's Delta State Governor Dr. Arthur Ifeanyi Okowa, was honored at Afrikfest for his exemplary drive towards maximum economic development and youth empowerment in the country's oil rich region.

He was represented by Kingsley Emu (Commissioner for economic development) and Emmanuel Chinye, (Commissioner for Culture & Tourism).

Delivering the keynote speech on behalf of the governor at the awards gala, Kingsley Emu said that "Africa has about 20% of the world's mineral resources... that makes Africa great... we do understand our limitations,

but we are staring to turn

things around... for instance Nevada has a population of 3 million people with a GDP of about \$156 million, while Delta state has a population of 6 million people with a GDP of just \$24 million, but we are realizing that this is due to over concentration on raw materials. Services is what Nevada is known for-hotels, restaurants, resorts, gaming, tourism, entertainment





etc. Nigeria has picked up along those lines. While thanking Afrikfest for the award, he noted that there was a prelude, when the Bill Gates Foundation funded CCN identified and honored Delta State as no. 1 in human capital investments in the region. Concluding, he said "Human capital investments unlocks the potentials in human beings, because the first thing a nation has, is its people, not the raw materials."
